Magna Vitae has had a fantastic quarter 1 from April – June 2023, with some impactful cultural events and connections, successful funding bids developing our lifestyle programmes and many engaging community programmes throughout East Lindsey. The quarter ended strongly from a leisure perspective, putting Magna Vitae in a stronger financial position than originally budgeted.

SO Festival returned on June 16, 17 in Skegness and 18 in Mablethorpe. Embracing its new community centred focus, the festival was moved from its usual spot in August, to accommodate and benefit the local residential communities. Highlights included some excellent, strategic cultural workshops, mesmerizing performances, captivating music, and breathtaking art installations. Thanks to talented artists, amazing staff, and an enthusiastic audience, this year's festival was extraordinary and very well received.

As well as the SO Festival, there has been more exciting cultural news for Skegness as The Embassy Theatre and the wider Magna Vitae team are delighted to announce that we have recently entered into a working partnership with the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC). The partnership aims to benefit our local communities for generations, by using arts and culture as a positive tool to boost health and well-being alongside learning and employment opportunities for young people within the district.

There has also been positive news for our community and lifestyle teams, with Magna Vitae being awarded £56,250 over three years from the Mental Health & Well-being Investment Fund, administered by Shine Lincolnshire. Magna Vitae's funding gives a much-welcomed boost to Ageless and Agile, a community programme that provides weekly physical and social activities for adults. The funding was celebrated at a launch event of the 'Ageless and Agile' programme in Skegness which took place on Tuesday 27th June at The Embassy Theatre, where partners and participants alike joined in with the physical and social activities, as a taster of the programme.

Alongside this funding, Magna Vitae has been awarded £4,000 for a Youth Programme GAME, funded by Sport England (Together Fund) and administered by Active Lincolnshire. The free sessions are intended for 13-17 year olds and aim to promote emotional health and wellbeing by offering a space for young people to be active and meet other people their own age. There has been a positive uptake on this with 18 of 25 available spaces already filled. The school holidays saw a busy "School's Out" and HAF programme. The 'School's Out' programme ran throughout Easter and May holidays, which were 4 and 8 days respectively. Whilst the HAF programme ran throughout Easter and saw 199 children booked across three venues, alongside a teen programme at Meridian Leisure Centre which had 14 young people participating. Alongside an action-packed programme, the provision also received a 5\* rating for Food Safety from ELDC at all three venues.

The Leisure Centre venues performed consistently strongly throughout the Quarter 1 period, recording 444 fitness members and 85 WaterWise members above target. All four venues were recently audited regards their Health and Safety practices with outstanding results. The average results came out at 88%, with Horncastle coming out on top at 92%. Health and Safety continues to be of the upmost importance, with the customers' safety always at the heart of what we do.

The Board of Trustees and Senior Leadership Team would like to take this opportunity to recognise and acknowledge all the hard work being undertaken by Magna Vitae staff who continue to produce excellent levels of customer care and satisfaction across all of our service areas. Simultaneously, we offer a similar thank you to all our custom for continuing to support us and in doing so, continuing to improve their own lives, health and wellbeing.

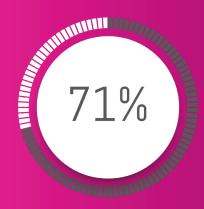
#### **Embassy Theatre**

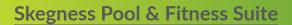
1177 children enrolled on our Learn to Swim Programme.

Over 10 children took part in crash course swimming lessons and workshops during the Easter holidays and May half term.

Over 100 children took part in Gymnastic based workshops and sessions during the Easter holidays and May half term.

A FREE water safety session took part where a families took part during Drowning Prevention Week in June. The event saw local police and fire services attend and provide a safety talk around water safety.

The Outdoor Swimming Pool reopened in May, allowing the venue to offer indoor and outdoor swimming for members and users.

#### **GAME (Get Active Move Everyday)**

The GAME project is funded by the Sport England Together Fund which is administered by Active Lincolnshire.

Currently 2 sessions per week take place at the Meridian Leisure Centre, so far 18 young people have accessed the sessions taking part in activities which include swimming, gym plus a variety of other activity sessions aimed at supporting mental & physical wellbeing. Next steps for the project are to roll out at another Magna Vitae venue and to explore funding opportunities to extend the programme beyond the current end date of 30th September.

#### **Holiday Activity and Food Programme**

The Easter programme was delivered at Meridian Leisure Centre, Skegness Tower Gardens and Station Sports Centre alongside a teen programme at the Meridian Leisure Centre. This programme saw some new activities including two 'Dance Free' silent disco sessions on Mablethorpe & Skegness beaches.

Each venue was registered as a new food business prior to Easter and all achieved the 5\* rating for Food Safety from ELDC across all three sites.

#### **Ageless & Agile**

The Ageless & Agile programme continues in Louth (Meridian Leisure Centre), Skegness (Embassy Theatre), Mablethorpe (Station Sports Centre) and Horncastle (Horncastle Pool & Fitness Suite), funded now through the Mental Health and Wellbeing Community Investment Fund.

**3** years funding: Year 1 - £25,000 | Year 2 -£18,750 | Year 3 - £12,500 | = £56,250

A launch event was held at Embassy Theatre and was well attended with 2 participants which included members of the public who were interested in taking part in the programme alongside representatives from ELDC, Shine, One You Lincolnshire, the NHS, Platform Housing, Age UK Lindsey and LCVS Social Prescribing Link workers.

Ageless and Agile sessions include a wide variety of activities which this quarter have included physical activity, a digital workshop, food waste awareness, health walks, dementia awareness and other activities.

#### **One You Lincolnshire**

170 individuals were assessed on the One You Lincolnshire Exercise on Prescription programme. Across all venues:

28.7% of referrals are continuing with a Magna Vitae membership.

#### School's Out Programme

The team have delivered over 25 activity sessions across 12 days in Easter Half Term and May Half Term.

The team came together and supported each other brilliantly, with the younger coaches taking on more responsibility & showing their individual development, progression and ability as they aim to become better coaches.

We had a diverse range of activities throughout the weeks, including things such as Tennis & Football through to Orienteering and Treasure Hunts! We also saw a big increase in participation at our sports day event in North Somercotes!

The coaching team expanded as we brought in  $\angle$  more young coaches. These two, along with our previous 3 who joined us back in February, mean we now have a great development team.

#### **Community Activities**

Walking Cricket and Pickleball are now being delivered by Meridian Leisure Centre, along with Fitness Circuits and YOGA sessions now being run by the instructors.

The Street Cricket sessions continues in Skegness. The sessions are about community engagement for local teenagers, giving youngsters a chance to experience cricket in a fun, enjoyable and relaxed way. Steve Crossley and Liam Fay normally deliver these sessions.

Marko continues to oversee and develop the Wellbeing Walks in partnership with Lincolnshire Co-op across East Lindsey. He takes the walks in Louth (2pm Tuesday), Binbrook and Wragby (10am and 1pm on Wednesdays).

We are now part of the Street Tag Programme. Street Tag is a family friendly initiative that rewards families and individuals for their physical activities such as Walking, Running, Cycling, among a host of other fitness activities.

Corby, Coventry, Hartlepool, Peterborough and Skegness join **26** existing areas in long-term partnership with the RSC. The RSC pledges to increase touring activity by 50% by 2026 to areas of structural disadvantage.

Skegness is one of five towns entering a new partnership with the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC) aimed at raising the aspirations of young people and having a positive impact on their learning, employment opportunities and wellbeing.

Magna Vitae, and schools from the Greenwood Academies Trust will work with the RSC in an expansion of activity made possible by an Arts Council England touring grant, Esmee Fairbairn Foundation award and Nesta – a foundation which supports a fairer start, healthy lives and sustainable futures. Other partners announced today include Coventry – The Belgrade Theatre; Peterborough – Ormiston Bushfield Academy; Corby – Corby Cube; Hartlepool – St. Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School.

Skegness has one of the lowest national health outcomes and nearly half the town's working age population are economically inactive due to poor health. The RSC partnership feeds into local plans to use arts and culture as a tool for regeneration and boosting health, well-being and opportunities for young people.

Megan Rice-Mundy, Ben Green and Luke Blanchard embarked on a trip of a lifetime to Romania, where through a Magna Vitae funded partnership, they participated in the leading arts festival in Europe, Sibiu International Theatre Festival (FITS). The festival takes place in the city of Sibiu, Romania, in June/July every year and lasts for ten days. Founded in 1993 the programme features a variety of art forms including; theatre, dance, circus, film, musical, opera, music and street shows.

Alongside these incredible performances, the festival offers a Volunteer Programme, where 500 volunteers from all over the world can experience different aspects of the event, of which Magna Vitae received two places. These two voluntary roles, were an opportunity for the candidates to develop, flourish and grow professionally and personally, in an international setting.

Megan and Ben were the two successful candidates for the volunteer programme. On asking why she applied for the position, Megan had said that she had wanted to push herself out of her comfort zone. Despite being nervous before she left, Megan said "I have learnt to be more independent and to have more confidence in myself". Whilst Ben, a student at Boston College (a partner of Magna Vitae), fed back that he is already planning to go back again next year.
